### **Principals Messages:**

Working together to make a difference, so all learnings flourish, is our imperative for 2024. As parents in partnership with the school and your child's teacher, you support, enable our teachers to build on their knowledge of your child and what support them to learn and be healthy, confident and happy at school.

Visitors to the office will notice that our Attendance target of 94% for the whole school is being celebrated each week, with the class with the highest attendance being displayed in the foyer. Classes are enjoying finding creative ways to take class photos to promote the importance of being at school every day.

Attendance % @ end of Week 6 – Whole School Percentage 93.8% TARGET is 94% Highest attendance award goes to 2/3B, with a score of 91.67%

What happens if you want to take a holiday as a family during school time?

As teachers, we understand that often it is easier and more economical for families to have vacations outside of the school holidays. However, your child's absence from school means they are missing their learning, which will then impact of their overall achievement for the term.

Any holidays for more then 10 days, will require an Exemption from school form to be completed. This ensures that the absence is approved and it will therefore not impact your child's attendance records. Please ensure you let your child's teacher know or contact the school if you require an exemption from school.

If your child is unwell and receiving medical treatment, and this is resulting in more than 2 days absence, please provide the school with a medical certificate at your earliest convenience.

If you require any support to ensure your child is in attendance at school, please contact the school and organise to speak with Mrs McPherson (Principal) or Ms Casey (Head of Special Education).



# Same day student absence notification

The safety and wellbeing of students are the highest priorities for the department. Parents need to know if their child hasn't turned up for school, and schools need to know when and why a child is absent.

State schools are required to notify parents on the same day that any student is absent from school without explanation.

At Chatsworth SS we send out a text message if we have an unexplained absence. If you receive an SMS, please respond or phone the office and provide the reason for the absence.

Send an email to your child's teacher or phone the office if you know your child is going to be away.

If you are planning a holiday of more than ten days, then please contact the office. This will require an exemption from schooling approved by the principal.

### Reading is a school priority in 2024

If you have a student in Prep, Year 1 or Year 2, you will have already heard the term 'decodable reading'. This year our whole staff are working on their knowledge and building the capacity to teach reading across all year levels. Through structured literacy blocks, the explicit instruction of phonemic awareness, phonics, comprehension, vocabulary and fluency is taught in all classrooms. Our teacher aides support students within the classroom to achieve success during structured literacy time, in reading. The attached, **Supporting your beginning reader** is a great resource to support your understanding of how children learn to read and how you can support your child's reading at home.





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# Supporting your beginning reader

#### Reading words

Look at the letters left to right

train

Say each sound

train

Blend the sounds

train.

Read the word

train

For words with uncommon spelling support your beginning reader by telling them the uncommon lettersound correspondence and modelling how to read the word.

said

In the word 'said' the /ĕ/ is spelled with 'ai' /s/ / ĕ / /d/ → said Shared reading, viewing and listening to texts beyond independent reading ability is important to build your child's language comprehension skills.

You can support your child when sharing texts by:

Discussing the text and forming predictions Discuss the title, words and images. Ask open ended questions:

- Why do you think there is an image of a \_\_\_\_?
- · What do you think will happen in this story?
- · What do you think will happen next?

Modelling your thinking and asking questions that encourage your child to make inferences and connections

- Make your thinking visible by modelling how you make an inference.
- What do you think?
- · Why do you think that?

Asking questions that promote back and forth discussion

- · Throughout the text take time to stop and discuss.
- Ask questions that encourage a response, rather than yes or no.
- · Why do you think the character did that?
- · How do you think the character would be feeling?

Talking about new words  Discuss the meaning of words and how they help us to understand texts.

Modelling how to summarise and make personal connections

- After reading parts or the whole text, discuss what the text was about, the main idea, what you liked and didn't like or any new learnings.
- Discussion might include what the story reminds you or your child of. Have you ever \_\_\_\_\_\_?
